## Unattended Buildings and Churches

The provision of information and interpretation when a facility is closed or unmanned is a major advantage of Info-Point. It can be located out of sight, secure from vandalism or theft, but left on 24/7 so that its Wi-Fi can serve up anything from leaflets to virtual tours at any time.

Low cost and future-proofing is another

big advantage. Most visitors already carry their own audio-visual device that they are familiar with using, and that you don't have to buy, maintain, update, and replace. Your Info-Point simply provides them with a 'local web' to use it on. With a design life of 10 years and up to 5 years warranty, you have only a one-time capital cost.



### Wesleyan birthplace - St Andrew's Church Epworth

The original home of John Wesley's family of Methodist fame, St Andrew's, Epworth is a historical pilgrimage destination that is also an active non-methodist church. It needed to minimise disruption from visitors and interpretive materials. An Info-Point positioned securely inside the church provides video tours, accessible inside or outside, even when the church is

closed or holding a service.

### Craflwyn Unmanned Visitor Centre - National Trust, Wales

As part of an unmanned visitor centre in the Snowdonia National Park, Info-Point serves up audio tours to visitors, switchable between English and Welsh, as well as downloadable trail leaflets.

The Info-Point is located so visitors cannot physically access it. It features a quick link QR code, and augments the more traditional visitor interpretation by delivering multiple languages simultaneously as well as downloadable interpretation.
